HEART SHAPES

Do you remember learning to make valentine hearts, folding the pink paper and cutting a swooshy curve through both layers? If you imagined your heart well, and cut it accurately enough, it would appear when you unfolded your craft, ready to be adorned with lace from paper doilies or glitter from a shaker.

Shaping the hearts of children is not quite as straightforward, but it happens as we work together to envision the good character we'd like to see in ourselves and our children, and work to trim the edges of their wants and will. At New Covenant, we work to shape hearts through both instruction and correction.

Instruction, the passing on of information and skills, happens in our classrooms in a variety of ways. We often start out with direct instruction,

in which a teacher might explain, illustrate, give examples, and make connections to new concepts. As the years go by, students are led to discover new concepts on their own, through reading, guided research and discussion. Like the paper heart unfolded to reveal its shape and perhaps a kind message, a new understanding uncovered can delight a learner at any age.

Then there's the correction side of learning. In any subject area, it's crucial for students to get feedback on whether or not they have mastered a process or a body of information. Often that comes from a teacher's bright colored markings, or even a verbal response, "Well, that's a thought, but I'm not sure you've understood what we were reading." As they mature, children begin to test themselves and

WINTER UNIFORM GUIDELINES

generate their own plans and processes for studying and mastering material more often.

Beyond simple mistakes in learning and thinking, there are times that each of us requires the correction of our behavior. Teachers who practice consistent classroom management and hold high expectations for the teaching/learning environment must sometimes confront student behavior. Our practice is to deal clearly with moral issues such as cheating, dishonesty,

and unkindness – yet with an important caveat. Whatever we say to a student must leave his or her dignity fully intact, and leave the student with the understanding that the teacher wants his success in school and in life enough to confront him.

Parents tell us that one of the top reasons they choose New Covenant is that we work on character – not just outward behavior, but also the heart motivations that underlie it. It's challenging work, shaping the minds and hearts of children, but worth it!
