ICE AND SNOW: YOUR CALL—YOU HAVE THE POWER by John Heaton, Headmaster

This morning's snow dusting reminded me that you might appreciate a review of our procedures when snow is in the forecast.

First, in the interest of full disclosure, I am a Florida Native, a Gators fan, and I didn't wear socks until I moved to Virginia. I was a young adult in college before I ever saw snow, and the first time it happened, I looked out my dorm window to view the light dusting that had fallen overnight. There wasn't much on the ground, the grass was poking through, and, as far as I could tell, it appeared that someone had brought in truckloads of white sand from Daytona Beach. Yep, that's what it looked like. White sand. Boy was I homesick.

When it comes to calling snow days for the purpose of delays or closures, my job gets tricky. I am certain to blow the call now and again. So be patient. Here is how my calculus works. When snow is called for, I get up very early and check all my weather sources. Few of them are any good at predicting what's going to happen. If a delay or closure is indicated, I will try to send notice of that to you by 6:00 a.m. I will use your email of record in RenWeb and change the "Closings" notice at WSET.com. Those are the only outlets that I will use.

Please be aware that we have students from Nelson County and halfway to Bedford, and from Big Island to Appomattox. That is a wide range, and it means that we may have a delay/closure because of conditions in one of those locations. Thus, there may be no snow on the ground where you are, but you can be assured that the call was made taking the whole community into consideration.

In heavy snow or ice events the main roads are plowed with reasonable speed. Fleetwood Drive, however, is usually the last road to be plowed (I have seen plows run down Wyndale Drive, and skip Fleetwood altogether!). Moreover, Fleetwood Drive has a northern exposure and lots of shade. It is not unusual, therefore, for most roads to be clear and dry while Fleetwood has an inch of ice. I could get 100% of our students as far as the News & Advance, but that last 1/8 mile will stop everything. There is no way that 200 cars can safely navigate by one another with even patchy ice on Fleetwood. Please keep that in mind when you are tempted to complain that school is still closed.

My preference, of course, is to minimize snow days. They are inconvenient to parents who must go to work and need childcare. Thus, New Covenant is often the last to close and, in some cases, we continue to have school when others shutter the night before. I do not make those decisions lightly, and I will not put you or your children at risk. I am simply suggesting that it is often the case that the weather event simply does not materialize as forecasted. In those situations, we go to school. On the other hand, when ice or freezing rain occurs, my call will be much more aggressive.

That said, the decision to come to school on a
