PROGRESS IN A DAY

Do you ever wonder—perhaps based on your children's reports—what goes on in music classes at New Covenant? Observing in band, general music, chorus or strings is always a fun duty for me, as I see children of all school ages engaged in delight-driven exercises, designed to produce beauty over the long haul. This engagement happens in our English and math classes as well, but after all, Rome wasn't built in a day.

In music classes, however, skills are built in a day! Progress is easily observable within one class period. In a band class I visited recently, middle school students began working on music for our Lessons and Carols program, attempting to reproduce melody and harmony in "Once in Royal David's City." First, the teacher had students sight-read the music. They looked at the page and tried to play together. The result was just what you might imagine, a cacophony of individuals doing their best, making individual sounds and individual errors on their own time. Positive feedback on the effort followed; then about

one minute of instruction. The second attempt, this time at only the first note, sounded beautiful and perfectly in tune. More feedback, more instruction, another attempt. A longer section was fixed. The teacher worked with each group of students who were playing the same instrument, and then put the whole thing back together again. Like magic, the tune was recognizable, and the student understood that they had learned something. This took only about twenty minutes.

Those of us who teach in the "regular" classrooms get glimpses of progress and see children delight in small successes. But a beginning reader doesn't often master the skills we teach in one day. Older students read, write and study for longer periods, and the opportunity to observe their own success—aka, the TEST—comes later. In music classes, kids are regularly able to see and hear their own achievement. That's encouraging to all of us and magic for our students.
