WHAT'S NEW? by John Heaton, Headmaster

e have always claimed that a classical, Christian education provides a broad range of opportunities and interests for children at the youngest ages and through the high school years. When students graduate from such a program, they are by no means specialists in any given discipline, but they have been required to engage with literature, music, art, drama, mathematics, science and language. Of course, not every student enjoys every subject to the same degree, but our experience has been characterized less by boredom, and more by that of surprise. Since a classical, Christian program is very prescriptive, requiring students to take classes in areas they might otherwise avoid, we find that they often discover a love for something they were not expecting. In many cases the joy of that discovery influenced a student's college and career path.

Founded in 1991, New Covenant just concluded its thirty-second year. During the past three decades we have relentlessly pursued the depth of our programming and the expansion of our facilities to bring the unexpected surprises that come with exploration to hundreds of students. Here are a few highlights of projects that added value to the New Covenant program this year.

In October 2022 the Permanent Things Campaign provided funds to add two new classrooms for use the by School of Rhetoric (see photos, p. 6). The classrooms were designed both with appropriate technology and with an eye to aesthetics for a pleasing learning experience. Further, the rooms were appointed with furniture that easily converts from lecture to seminar format to facilitate group discussion. The classrooms were completed at a cost of \$417,266 and were completely paid for with donated funds.

The Permanent Things Campaign has also raised the necessary funds to develop an outdoor workout

facility on "back campus" below the service drive (see p. 6). This facility is an outdoor adjunct to the Workman-Hall Fitness Center and will be accessed by stairs just a few steps away from that facility. A workout station will be installed with 26 activity stations servicing more than 30 athletes at a time. A tennis wall, basketball court, and discus and shot put stations will be included as well. This project begins as we go to print and is scheduled to be open by the first day of school in August 2023.

The New Covenant library is a very visible part of the campus. Through a generous grant from the

McCurdy Family Foundation a listening station was created and installed in the bay window overlooking the courtyard. The station was designed for our youngest students to use small laptops



on which books from the library have been recorded. Students can read and listen to books during their library time. The listening station was created and installed by New Covenant parent, **Toby Davies** (Ainsley-3rd; Ember-1st), whose notable skills have provided a beautiful addition to the library space.

Finally, the Moomaw Center underwent an upgrade to its lighting system with eight new theater lights installed in the ceiling. For the past twenty years, the drama troupe has relied on light trees, which provided reliable but limited light options. The two trees also required great care in setup and breakdown, as well as "fencing" trip hazards for guests to theater productions. The new lighting is remotely controlled, and takes advantage of LED technology with nearly infinite lighting options.

VALEDICTORIAN

He has played on our soccer team all four years, winning the MVP award in both sophomore and junior years and also earning a place on the All-Conference First Team last year and both All-Conference and All-State First Teams this year. EXCELLENCE IN Classical language

A s a Classical Christian School, New Covenant offers its students the unique opportunity to study ancient Latin and Greek, giving them insight into our cultural and linguistic past. In Latin we translate and discuss excerpts of Cicero's speeches, Caesar's De Bello Gallico, Vergil's Aeneid, and the Vulgate Bible, including the Apostles' Creed and John I. In Greek we translate and discuss texts from the Gospels, the letters of St. Paul, the Apocrypha, and the Nicene and Chalcedonian Creeds. Both our Latin and Greek curricula contain texts that have defined orthodox Christology for more than 1700 years, have provided the basis for the political liberty that eventually flourished in the West, and have left their mark in our culture within art, music and modern literature.

This year the Classical Language Award is granted to a senior who has accumulated five years of highschool-level classical language. Through years of Latin and Greek, this student has demonstrated competency, dedication and facility in the study of ancient languages as reflected in their grade average, their overall reading ability, and their curiosity for understanding the ancient world and its literature. We congratulate the Classical Language Award winner, Jenna Hackenbracht.

EXCELLENCE IN FINE ARTS AWARD

S killed artists are invitational in their craftsmanship, encouraging others to see, hear, and interact with the world as they perceive it. To successfully communicate their own perceptions, artists must gain access to the heart, the residence of reflection, emotion and desire. This is no easy task, for they must first be moved themselves, with deep appreciation for their subject, commitment to close study, and dedication to development of their craft.

The recipient of the Class of 2023 Fine Arts Award does indeed reflect these traits. He is captivated by music and is careful to learn from great composers, local artists, and mentors here at school. EXCELLENCE IN MATHEMATICS AND Sciences Award

In the true liberal arts tradition, the New Covenant School of Rhetoric has a comprehensive math and science program, offering eleven high school mathematics and science courses. These are ancient terms, mathematics and science, the first from the Greek word *mathema* and the other from the Latin *scientia*, both meaning knowledge or that which we come to know. Plato stated that "the study of mathematics leads the mind toward pure reason and cultivates the true love of wisdom" and we affirm this as we present the Excellence in Mathematics & Science Award each year to recognize a student who has consistently demonstrated both an interest in and a keen ability with these subjects.

It would be an understatement to say that this year's recipient is inquisitive and enthusiastic. He has an eager interest that is contagious. He wants to know what's beyond the surface of the idea, drawing conclusions and making connections. In AP Calculus, he spent his free time watching videos of concepts not yet taught (even examples well beyond AP Calculus AB). On the final project of the year, he was not satisfied to simply fulfill the requirements; he wanted to have fun with it, investigating math beyond what we had done in class, including integrating a piecewise function. He will certainly continue his excitement for all things math and science in his college career.

EXCELLENCE IN HUMANITIES AWARD

The English poet Matthew Arnold wrote that a superior education is one that introduces people to "the best that has been thought and said." At New Covenant, we aspire to this, setting before our students patterns of excellence and incentives to noble action, inspiring them with the elevating power of the classical, Christian tradition, the love for which sharpens moral vision and forms strong character. Therefore, the Humanities Award is given annually to the student who exhibits an extraordinary delight and talent in the study of literature, history and theology.

The Humanities Award is given to a student who has been an outstanding scholar of the written and spoken word. She is a diligent reader, combining her interests and requirements whenever possible. During class discussions, her depth of knowledge and willingness to share her wisdom set her apart. This student approaches the study of history with enthusiasm and delight, engaging even difficult moments in the past with curiosity and a desire to understand. She has a well-developed sense of justice and rightness, which she applies thoughtfully when evaluating the past. She writes with eloquence, insight and excellence, dissecting historical events and the people who shaped them with precision and nuance. 
THE SOR EPIC HALLWAY
