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and inspire us. But the clock was ticking in my head, I needed to get out and see the world, to be grown up, to put aside childish things. And then it was over, and I never looked back.

St. Paul wrote to his young protégé St. Timothy that “godliness with contentment is great gain, for we brought nothing into this world, and we cannot take anything out of the world, but if we have food and clothing, with these we shall be content.” We often associate these words with death because they appear in the traditional funeral service. And while this is a worthy application, Paul isn’t meditating upon his end, or Timothy’s for that matter. The question he is addressing is, “What does it take to live the good life?” or more particularly, “What will Timothy do as the young bishop of Ephesus?” He was a young man, surrounded by older men and women who dismissed his apostolic ministry because of his youth. What Timothy needed was some wrinkles and a balding head. That would win him respect! Or, perhaps more than age, money might buy a great deal of respect. Paul wrote, “Those who desire to be

rich fall into temptation, into a snare, into many senseless and hurtful desires that plunge men into ruin and destruction.” Both of these, respect and wealth, were the things that appealed to me as an impatient young man, and I am sure it is just as true for our students today.

But this runs contrary to the ethos that we have established here at New Covenant. The Greek concept of *scholē* or ‘leisure’ indicates a different attitude toward learning altogether. Perhaps ‘restful learning’ would be a better way to describe *scholē*. It is a commitment to learning the good stuff to live the good life. *Scholē* is a way of saying in very practical, physical ways, ‘being transformed by the good and true and beautiful is better than having lots of stuff and being super popular.’ It is a way of orienting ourselves to the Creator that we are not anxious about what we shall eat, or what we shall wear, or where we shall live. Jesus says that the Gentiles (those who don’t know the true God) are the ones who are anxious about those kinds of things. Jesus says that the antidote to anxiety is to seek God’s kingdom first, knowing for sure that the loving God will give us all we need.

As chaplain of New Covenant Schools, I think all the time about the advice my guidance counselor gave me more than 30 years ago. I want our students to embrace the moment that God has given them and rejoice in it. A life lived well, in favor with God and

man, is surely the greatest that any of us could wish for. To take time to read a book, to pray, to care for a friend in need, or better, the stranger. All these make a remarkable life. This is ‘godliness with contentment.’ Of course, it would be fantastic if one of our graduates found the cure for cancer or invented an infinite source of energy! We all would be so proud. But my hope, one that I share with all the faculty at New Covenant Schools, is that it was in these early moments of our students’ lives that they learned that every moment is to be relished, and that every lesson is to be learned for its own sake, and that every ambition finds its perfection when it is offered to God in thanksgiving.
