

Miscellaneous Uniform Clarifications

Athletic Jerseys: athletes on any New Covenant sports team may wear the sports jersey **on Fridays only**. Jerseys do not need to be tucked in at school. If a T-shirt needs to be worn beneath the jersey for modesty, it must be a New Covenant T-shirt.

Athletic Jackets: may only be worn on Fridays only

New Covenant Hoodies and Fleece:

Mondays/Wednesdays: students may wear the navy blue New Covenant uniform hoodie, or the navy blue New Covenant fleece jacket, or the cardigan

Tuesdays/Thursdays: navy blue New Covenant fleece jacket, or the cardigan

Fridays: navy blue New Covenant Uniform hoodie, navy blue New Covenant uniform fleece jacket, New Covenant sweatshirt, or any other New Covenant hoodie, fleece, cardigan or sweatshirt designed for a New Covenant team or event (for example, a pink volleyball sweatshirt, navy blue athletic jacket)

Non-New Covenant sweaters, hoodies, jackets: are disallowed in the building especially in classrooms and the hallways.

Winter uniform: Girls' leggings, if worn, should meet the socks, match the uniform, and fit like tights, not sweat pants. No wild or crazy colors or leggings that stop mid-calf. Leg warmers are disallowed. On days when the projected high for the day is 32° or below, girls may wear slacks, even on dress days, with their normal dress day tops. (If the slacks have loops, a belt must be worn.)

Long sleeved tees may be worn under long sleeved shirts for extra warmth. ***If the tee is white or navy it may be worn under a short sleeved*** uniform shirt as well.

Outerwear, other than the New Covenant hoodie, cardigan, or fleece, may not be worn in the building. This includes scarves, gloves, hats and other winter accessories.

Free Dress Days: Unless otherwise defined, free dress days mean that students may wear non-uniform tops (no offensive language or pictures) and jeans. Shoes must have closed toes and a least a strap on the heel.

***Note: The School of Rhetoric (grades 9-12) has a separate dress code policy with privileges which do not extend to middle school students.**
