

## FROM GOODE TO GRACE: WHY WE PAUSE AT 8:48 AM

very morning at 8:48am, energetic and still sleepy New Covenant Middle School students as well as faculty make their way to the sunlit chapel for daily Matins. This is a new practice for grades 5-8 this year and lasts for about ten minutes. This might seem like a routine common to most Christian schools, except perhaps for its purpose and how we aim toward it. As part of the New Covenant community, Middle School students and faculty are fortunate to have the opportunity to meet daily in addition to our weekly chapel to cultivate the virtue of reverence and the habit of recollection.

In the spring and summer of 2020, when New Covenant could not meet in person during the pandemic, a group of Middle School faculty members came together to hike several mountains—100 to 150 miles by the end of the season. One day I was driving a carful of New Covenant faculty, including Mrs. Spiva, Mrs. Olenik, Dr. Uminn, and Mrs. Hostetler to that day's hiking destination. The conversation was light, and the morning sun shone as we headed towards Flat Top Mountain through Goode.

A large truck, which we had been following for a few miles, stopped in front of us and began to turn

Please join us this Wednesday from 2:00-3:00pm in the chapel for a time of prayer for our students, teachers, staff, and community.



left across the opposite lane into the Goode Country Store parking lot. Just as the driver neared the middle of the opposite lane, a car coming on at about 40 mph from the opposite direction suddenly crossed into our lane, appeared to be momentarily airborne, passed quickly over the front of our vehicle, and slammed down into the ditch to our right.

Apparently, the truck driver in front of us did not see the oncoming vehicle as he began his turn. We narrowly missed a head-on collision. It took my breath away. For a few moments I considered what might have happened if we'd been even slightly closer to that truck than we were. In that moment, in our near miss, my attention suddenly shifted to God and to the eternal value of every soul that was in my car. I thought of their children and spouses and what might have been. That moment of recollection, in addition to the actual protection we received, was a great grace that lifted me out of the everyday to the reality of the infinite value of each person in my car and to reality itself: God with us. Every time I think about that incident. I am recollected: I am reoriented to the ultimate reality and thankful for the grace of recollection inspired by the accident that almost happened.

Of course, one does not have to have such a dramatic experience to be reoriented to the reality of God's presence in a special way. There are far safer moments during which we can receive the same benefit, prayer being the most obvious one when we actively remember that God is not an idea or a principle. He's a person who is with us. Attending church and reading the Bible are also ways we explicitly remind ourselves that God IS, that he loves us, and that he has called us to love him and one another. And just as we at times must straighten things that have become crooked, in moments of recollection, our

hearts can be realigned with the ultimate reality of God with us and what that means for us and our neighbor.

Cultivating the habit of recollection is the purpose of Middle School Matins; an intentional pause during the day to contemplate God's presence with us and to see ourselves and others more accurately in his light.

What do we do during Matins? First, we process into the chapel in such a way



that our movements reflect a change from the day-to-day routine. We take our time settling into the quiet so that our minds and hearts can take on a more restful posture. We sing the Lord's Prayer and the Psalms. We listen to a Gospel reading and leave a moment of quiet afterwards to consider it. We also pray with the Book of Common Prayer.

Recently Mr. Hart reviewed this practice with students. "To start," he said, "you'll notice that it's called the Book of 'Common' Prayer. 'Common' is a word that comes from the Latin communis, which means common or shared. So, our prayer is 'shared' prayer. Shared with whom? Well, first, with each other in this room. There is a beautiful genius to how

we can all speak the same words and yet see our own specific situations in our hearts when we do so. The Prayer Book gives us this shared universe of language, where one shared voice takes up all our particular and individual worries, fears, hopes, requests, and offers them to God together."

That roadside near miss, one isolated moment of divine grace, continues to serve as an abrupt recollection and occasion for reverence. But the daily quiet, shared time in our sunlit chapel cultivates the habit of recollection and reverence more gently among our Middle School community. It is more than just a 10-minute pause. By choosing to step away, to quiet ourselves, and to recall God's presence, we teach our students not just how to pray, but how to be reoriented to the True, the Good, and the Beautiful. To God. In this shared reorientation we can be refreshed to face our duties with grace and virtue, not as individuals going about our separate lives, but as a recollected and beloved community of God's people.
