Each year on the Friday closest to October 4 we gather parents and students with a menagerie of pets and other domesticated creatures for the annual "blessing of the animals." And it's a hoot! Dogs bark. Children laugh and share with their friends. A few bearded dragons remain motionless in their cages. Cats cower in their carriers. Once I blessed a goat which had failed in breeding, and within the year the nanny had twin kids! On the other hand, I blessed a milk cow, which within a few months tragically

expired. The whole business prompted a friend of mine to quip, "Is this really necessary? Who made this up anyway?"

Of course it's not "necessary," but I'm always up for a good time with my students. It does, however, run a little deeper. scavenging of the neighborhood came to be. It's just fun. When gift-wrapped boxes alone would be enough, we had to add stockings "by the chimney with care," but few remember why this is now mandatory. Think about it. What would Christmas be without stockings stuffed with whatever a sock can hold? And who had the great idea that a live nativity scene would be appropriate in church anyway? That would have been St. Francis of Assisi who was the first to arrange for it in 1223.

But blessing the animals? What's this about? Yes; that's Francis, too. First, it's about having fun, but of course, there's more to it than you might think. The first Friday in October is his feast day, a day we mark in the New Covenant academic cycle. Francis was born into wealth, served in the military during a time of turbulence in the Italian body politic, and eventually came to faith in Christ. His was a total conversion. Well-connected as he was, he shocked not only his parents, but the entire community when he renounced his inherited wealth and founded what we now know as the Franciscan order of monks.

The world was not particularly in a frame of mind to listen to him. Then, as now, the Gospel fell on many deaf ears, and Francis was reported to have taken his preaching to the animals in the forest. While that might not be completely historically accurate, nonetheless, Francis and his order were notable for shunning the comforts of wealth, choosing to live in simplicity and embracing a self-induced poverty in imitation of Christ. As such he was more closely attuned to the natural world, with its goodness and beauty, which were themes of his ministry. The English hymn, "All Creatures of our God and King" is based on a poem he wrote, which first appeared in the Public School Hymn Book in 1919 (imagine that!).

Francis came to be remembered in rural settings by those whose lives were more closely dependent upon livestock. Annual prayers for abundant crops and harvest along with prayer for healthy animals are common in the Anglican tradition. With this sensibility comes the annual ritual, writ small for children, in which we affirm man's dominion over the creation, and in which we embrace our responsibility to care for and maintain it.

If you are in your first year of association with New Covenant, please plan to join us with your pet this Friday in the tower courtyard for the annual Blessing of the Animals!

If you're coming . . .

- All pets welcome; dogs must remain on leashes.
- Any domesticated animals are welcome, including chickens, ducks, pigs, and horses!
- All animals must be those that are in the care of our children.
- Grammar School begins at 2:00pm.
- Middle School begins at 2:40pm.
- If you plan to take your student directly from the area, please make sure to sign out the student with their teacher.
