At least five of these players have committed to playing volleyball year-round. While others move on in the offseason, some of these players have chosen to work on this particular craft for months on end, taking few if any breaks. They have sacrificed other athletic opportunities to work and play volleyball almost non-stop. Building for this moment.

We also know that one of the only ways to learn and improve in any task is through experience. Pick anything that is difficult or stressful. It all becomes less difficult and less stressful with experience. Public speaking, math equations, building construction, and even volleyball. The more you do and the more you experience those difficult and stressful situations, the more comfortable you will be. It is also no wonder that when we seek expert opinions (think doctors, plumbers, electricians, coaches, contractors) one of the first things we'll look for is how much experience they have! How long have they been working in this field? Experience means you've seen more, done more, learned more. This team had that experience. This team is made up of players who have won conference championships, and just as importantly, lost conference championships. They've played and lost in the state playoffs, have won and lost against the best teams in the area and the state. The core of this team has played over 50 competitive volleyball games together over the last two years. Through all of that, they have been working and experiencing and learning. Building for this moment.

Even with—or perhaps because of that experience, we all fail. Sometimes we fail over and over. Failure in a vacuum is not especially helpful. Because for

some, failure means the end. For those like this volleyball team, failure was simply an opportunity. Failure has led to learning, to re-evaluating, and therefore to improving. This team, though young, had high expectations last season and were selected to compete in the state playoffs after the regular season. They had to travel to Chesapeake for the first round and they lost. They lost miserably! They didn't play their best. Moreover, their process just wasn't yet complete. But here's the key: this particular failure prompted innovation, reflection, learning, and improvement. Coach Rigg and the players decided they wanted more. They decided their building needed more finishing and refining. So, they worked and they built. They started their new season in February. Not in August when the fall season should have begun, but in February. Then March, and April, and on and on. Not only that, but they also practiced at 6:00am because that's when the gym was available. When normal, functioning people (like me) were still in bed, these girls were practicing. This team has been working individually and collectively since February with a distinct purpose. Building for this moment.

They had put together a solid foundation. They had honed their craft. They had been through it all, seen it all, and done it all. They have learned through victory and learned even more through defeat. They have played big games and little games, hard games and easy games. They have practiced in front of the

coaches and in empty gyms and in backyards and empty fields. They have practiced before the sun rose and have practiced after it set. They have been building for the moment when that last serve hit the floor and they were crowned State Champions.

Now, we all understand we are never complete; the building never truly stops. We should always be aiming to get better and learn even more, however incrementally. And this team has already started talking about how they will train and practice in the coming weeks and months in an effort to repeat. But for this exact moment and this exact time, well, they were built for this.
